Do a Water Maintenance Check

Old or unmaintained equipment can mean increased water usage. Work with facilities maintenance specialists to determine a reasonable preventative maintenance schedule.

Don't Run Appliances on Half Loads

If you have a dishwasher, washing machine or similar appliance within your building, you should only run this on a full load.

Install Water Saving Measures

Use a water butt to collect rainwater off your roof. Water butts usually hold around 200litres of water which can be used for watering plants or cleaning vehicles.
